MESSAGE FROM OUR CO-CHAIRS

Dr Iram Sattar MBE

This year has been a year of mixed emotions with losses and celebrations. Although I started the year with a personal achievement having been awarded the MBE in the 2022 New Year Honours list, the year ended with the loss of my younger brother Farhan Sattar while he was waiting for a heart transplant. MWNUK had responded to a public consultation in 2018 on organ donation highlighting the important role women can play in raising awareness about having conversations around being a donor. We hope to take this work forward. Sadly, Baroness Haleh Afshar also passed away in 2022. She was one of the founding members of MWNUK and had been Honorary President of the charity since stepping down as a trustee.

Health has already been a key theme this year. To improve health and wellbeing we started a Walking Project that has involved recruiting Volunteer Walk Leaders in different parts of England. We also launched findings of our research on Muslim women's maternity experiences which put a spotlight on the inequalities they face. The report received national media coverage.

I would like to congratulate Shaista Gohir on her appointment to the House of Lords. This is a huge achievement given the highly competitive process; the appointment is very well deserved, and we are proud of her. Shaista will make an excellent addition to the House of Lords. Her dedication and passion for public service is demonstrated in all the roles she has been involved in, particularly how she has led the development of MWNUK with her ideas and vision.

This has been a year of change and celebration. We moved into new offices, resumed volunteer recruitment and have undergone board and staff changes. Congratulations to Shaista Gohir, who stepped down from the board and became the CEO and was also appointed as a Crossbench peer in the House of Lords. Like Baroness Afshar, Shaista will no doubt continue to take forward social justice and gender equality for all women and not just Muslim women.

We are also pleased that Faeeza Vaid MBE has joined the MWNUK board of trustees after stepping down as Executive Director at the end of 2021. Having already spent 13 years at MWNUK, she brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to the board. Congratulations also to trustee Khursheed Wadia who has been promoted to Professor. However, to due to the commitments of her new role she is sadly stepping down from the board. We would like to thank her for her valuable contribution over the last 11 years.




ABOUT MWNUK

Muslim Women's Network UK (MWNUK) is a national membership charity based in Birmingham that works to improve social justice and equality for Muslim women and girls. MWNUK began as an informal group in 2003, became a CIC in 2008 and charity in 2013.

Initially we focussed on campaign and advocacy work. However, after being regularly contacted by Muslim women desperate for help we responded to this need by setting up a culturally sensitive national helpline and counselling service in 2015.

In addition to providing direct frontline support, we utilise the experiences of Muslim women and girls uncovered through the helpline enquiries (and through additional research projects), to identify policy and practice gaps.

We use this information to inform decision makers in public bodies and government and to inform our community campaigns. We also capacity build women and develop information resources so they are better aware of their rights.

Dr Iram Sattar MBE

Co-Chair of MWNUK

Dr. Iram Sattar, received recognition in the 2022 New Year Honours list. She was awarded an MBE for Services to Health and Wellbeing of Vulnerable People.

Iram has been a doctor for over 20 years with the NHS and whilst caring for patients has continued in her trustee roles. For more than 10 years, she has served on the boards of Muslim Women's Network UK and The Passage. Her influence and voluntary work have helped to improve the quality of life of some of the most disadvantaged and poorest in society. As one of the recipients of an honour in the Queen's platinum jubilee year, Iram was also invited to the Platinum Jubilee National Service of Thanksgiving held at St Paul's Cathedral in London (June 2022) to mark the 70th anniversary of the accession of Queen Elizabeth II.

Shaista Gohir was appointed to the House of Lords in June 2022 as a non-party political peer. She was selected by the House of Lords Appointments Commission following an independent competitive process and recommended to the Prime Minster because of the expertise and experience she would be able to bring to the work of the House.

Shaista has worked in the charity sector for nearly twenty years and is one of the founding members who established MWNUK as an independent organisation and has led its growth since, serving as the Chair and Executive Director and building MWNUK to become a highly respected and award-winning charity.

To oversee the charity's next period of growth, Shaista stepped off the board in 2022 to lead it as the CFO

Professor Khursheed Wadia

In recognition of her academic work, Khursheed Wadia was promoted from Associate to full Professor of Sociology at the University of Warwick.

She has written and researched extensively on gender and political participation/civic engagement (including on women from Muslim communities and politics), gender, migration and ethnicity. Her book, Muslim Women and Power: Political and Civic Engagement in West European Societies, 2017 (co-authored with Daniele Joly) won the UK Political Studies Association's 2018 Mackenzie prize for the best book in political science.





Although the helpline can be contacted about any issue, domestic abuse and poor mental health continue to be the top issues. Women are struggling to access mental health services and perhaps not surprisingly there has also been a small increase in more serious cases where callers are self-harming or having suicidal thoughts. Some of the Helpline's interventions have been life-saving. For example, one woman called the helpline while she was on her way to a train station to take her own life.

"We have noticed that the number of service users choosing to contact us via email has increased. The cases have also become more complex and now involve more staff time with support lasting much longer. For example, we have started to see transnational abandonment cases.

There has also been a slight rise in Muslim women with disabilities who need help - in one case a woman who had both visual and hearing impairments was experiencing emotional abuse and coercive control and wanted help to get away from her family."

Member Feature Razia Hadait Awarded the MBE

MWNUK nominated Razia Hadait, founder and CEO of Himaya Haven for the MBE honour. We were pleased that she was awarded the MBE in the Queen's birthday honours in June 2022. Razia has been a community activist for 24 years championing the needs of disadvantaged and marginalised groups from diverse ethnic minority communities living in the most deprived areas of Birmingham.



As Razia was one of the recipients during the Queen's platinum jubilee year, she was amongst the selected members of the public who were invited to the funeral which was an historical event attended by world leaders.

In September 2021, MWNUK was heartbroken to learn about the death of Fawziyah Javed. On the first anniversary of her death, MWNUK along with others helped to organise a vigil in Edinburgh. MATERNITY RESEARCH

Invisible - Maternity Experiences of Muslim Women from Racialised Minority Communities


Launched on 13th July 2022 at the House of Commons via the APPG on Muslim Women. The research uncovered a culture of maternity abuse that is contributing to 1 in 5 Muslim women saying their maternity care is 'poor' or 'very poor', particularly during their labour, birth and the post birth period in hospital.

1022 online surveys

online surveys completed **37**

When experiences were compared to national average statistics, data showed that Muslim women from racialised minority communities were:

- 1.6 times more likely to have their labour induced
- 1.5 times less likely to be given an epidural for pain relief
- 1.4 times more likely to have an instrumental birth
- 2.4 times more likely to have postpartum haemorrhage
- 2.1 times more likely to be in prolonged labour
- 1.3 times more likely to have an emergency caesarean



Senior midwife Donna Ockendon spoke at the event.

The report was covered by BBC Newsnight, Huffington Post and the Open Democracy. The Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists and the Royal College of Midwives released public statements and will consider the recommendations.

The report is having an impact already

- Downloaded 1,855 times
- Endorsement of the report by the new incoming RCOG President Elect Consultant Ranee Thakar, who also gave an interview to BBC Newsnight
- Endorsement by senior midwife Donna Ockenden who Chaired the Shrewsbury and Telford Maternity Inquiry spoke at the launch and provided an interview to BBC Newsnight
- Donna Ockenden has asked MWNUK to be on the Advisory Group for the Nottingham Maternity Inquiry
- Have made introduction to Nottingham Muslim Women's Network to ensure the Nottingham Maternity Inquiry hears diverse family voices
- NHS Race and Health Observatory has invited MWNUK to be on their maternity group
- NHS Resolution has responded to one recommendation on ensuring ethnicity data is collected for maternity medical negligence claims and is reviewing systems

- Presentations made to various NHS teams including National Health Conference on the Women's Health Strategy, which was attended by senior leadership in the NHS
- DHSC invited MWNUK to present key findings and recommendations of the report to the Patient Safety and Primary Care Minister James Morris and other senior NHS stakeholders. They tweeted about the report and the Department named the report in its media statement published on the government website where the Minister was quoted as saying:

"I would like to thank the Muslim Women's Network and Birthrights for sharing invaluable insights on the maternity experiences of Muslim and ethnic minority women, and I look forward to working with the system to set out actions on how we can ensure better care for all women."

Victim's Bill



The Ministry of Justice conducted a public consultation to inform its new Victim's Law - a Bill that will build on the foundations provided by the Victims' Code to substantially improve victims' experiences of the criminal justice system.

MWNUK responded to this consultation (3 Feb 2022) based on findings from its research, Muslim Women's Experience of the Criminal Justice System (June 2019). Our concerns included:

 Poor communication with victims and lack of support resulting in victims dropping cases and not getting justice

- Victims of sexual abuse receiving poor service including arbitrarily not prosecuting
- Lack of awareness of the victim's code and the victim's compensation scheme
- Not understanding how honour-based abuse intersects with other issues such as revenge porn and how risk is measured
- Lack of awareness of specialist local BAME organisations by police forces and Police Crime Commissioners wasting resources on tick box projects
- Police not arresting perpetrators when they breach orders thus putting victim's safety at risk

Police Super Complaint

A super complaint was submitted to the Home Office by the charity Halo to which MWNUK provided several case studies as evidence of poor service provided by police forces to ethnic minority Muslim women victims of sexual abuse. We are pleased that our evidence helped to secure the super complaint being upheld after an investigation by the HM Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire and Rescue Service, which has resulted in recommendations for improvement.
