



PROJECTS

Wellbeing Walking Project

We completed a 12-month walking project in September 2023 to help reduce the negative impact of inactivity and to improve health and wellbeing particularly of Muslim women.

Organ Donation Project



Sadly, in December 2022, Dr. Iram Sattar (Co-Chair of MWNUK) lost her younger brother while he was waiting for a heart transplant. Farhan Sattar was aged 43 and leaves behind a wife and four children.

The organ donation project is therefore dedicated to Farhan and raised awareness about organ donation including the Islamic perspectives. We believe Muslim women can play a key role in having these conversations. The project resulted in 10 small coffee morning events and two online events, blogs and online recorded content including one video sharing Farhan's story which will be promoted in 2024.

People from Black, Asian, Mixed or Other minority ethnic backgrounds have to wait longer for an organ transplant due to low number of people from these communities registered as organ donors.

18% on the organ transplant waiting list were of Asian heritage but only made up **3%** of the deceased donors (2021-22).

10% of people on the organ donation waiting list were of Black heritage but only made up **2%** of the deceased donors (2021-22).

Approximately **25%** of women who contact the MWN Helpline about marriage and divorce are not in a legally recognised marriage (i.e. nikah only in the UK with no additional civil marriage).

We therefore produced a short video to raise awareness about the importance of being in a legally recognised marriage and the consequences of not being in one when a marriage breaks down.



Women of Colour in Politics



In June 2023, we partnered with Centenary Action Group to hold an event in the House of Lords to encourage more women of colour to become councillors and MPs. Women shared their experiences and aspirations. The tips that emerged were published in a blog on the MWN Hub.



Campaign Letter - Let cyberflashing legislation protect victims

On 15 May, Muslim Women's Network UK signed a joint letter with Bumble, Refuge and Grazia UK, which was published in the Telegraph. The letter called for the cyberflashing clauses in the Online Safety Bill to be strengthened.

"We welcome legislation against cyberflashing. However, we believe this Bill does not do enough to protect victims. If a consent-based approach to cyberflashing isn't included in the Bill, women will continue to feel unsafe, violated and vulnerable in both online and offline spaces."

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

MET Police

We sent a joint letter with the Fawcett Society, Runnymede Trust and Agenda Alliance, to Sir Mark Rowley, Commissioner of the MET Police, which resulted in a meeting with him.

We raised concerns about how the police were tackling violence against women and girls.



Leader of the House of Commons



A round table meeting was hosted by Penny Mordaunt which Muslim Women's Network UK attended to discuss what more Parliament can do as an institution to support women both domestically and internationally.

Judges Handbook

MWNUK were asked to provide feedback on areas where a Judges Handbook, The Equal Treatment Bench Book (ETBB), could be strengthened. The handbook helps judges to understand the different circumstances of people appearing in courts and tribunals. We made a number of recommendations.



Law Commission dia



A meeting was held with the Law Commission to discuss financial remedies in divorce. This provided an opportunity to share experiences of the financial hardship that some Muslim women experience when going through a divorce and the barriers they face.

Gaza

During the debate she condemned the collective punishment of innocent Palestinian civilians and raised concerned about the misinformation being used to suppress legitimate expressions of solidarity with them.





Illegal Migration

During the various stages of the bill she raised concerns about the proposed indefinite detention of pregnant migrant women. She along with Baroness Lister, Baroness Sugg and Bishop of Gloucester successfully managed to challenge the government and persuaded the House of Lords to maintain the 72-hour time limit that had existed previously. This amendment will protect pregnant women and their unborn babies from the harms of indefinite detention.

INTERNATIONAL

Saudi Human Rights Commission Delegation

(Sept 2023)

Muslim Women's Network UK hosted a delegation from the Saudi Human Rights Commission, which included its President Dr. Hala Al-Tuwaijri.



A roundtable discussion was held in the House of Lords. The rights of Muslim women both in the UK and Saudi Arabia were discussed.

COP28 Fringe Event UAE (Dec 2023)



MWNUK CEO Baroness Gohir was a guest speaker at a fringe event during the COP28 Climate Change Conference hosted by the Global Citizen Forum where she spoke about what it means to be a global citizen particularly emphasising the lack of empathy amongst world leaders today.

Doha Forum

Qatar (Dec 2023)

MWNUK CEO Baroness Gohir attended the Doha Forum, which is a global platform that brings together leaders from different fields to discuss the pressing issues facing the world such as security, climate change, women's health, human rights, Al and data.

However, a key theme during the two days was the Gaza situation. Baroness Gohir along with Baroness Warsi, Naz Shah MP and Lord Purvis had a meeting with HE Lolwah Al Khater, Assistant Foreign Minister of Qatar to discuss the ongoing situation.
